## RULES AND REGULATIONS

***The Pavilion will be open on Friday morning at 8:30 am for receipt of entries.***

***The Show will be open to the general public from 9:00 am on Show day.***

**MEMBERSHIP FEES:** Family \$20, Adults \$10 (over 18 years). Privileges of membership : (a) free admission to all sections of the Annual Show, unless otherwise stated. In the case of family membership, admission on the day of the Show for members (two membership tickets issued) plus members of family under 18 years.

(b) Right to nominate for office within the Association. (c) Power to vote at all meetings and to elect committee (d) Free Admission to ground for member's vehicles provided that such vehicle is parked where the committee may direct.

**ADMISSION TO GROUND:** Saturday \$10 per adult, \$5 per aged pensioner, \$5 per child under 18 years. Pre-school no charge. Family \$25 (2 Adults, 2 Children).

**ENTRY FEES:** Charges shown with headings at each section in schedule.

Exhibitors will be held responsible for any damages that may be done by any exhibit and the association reserves the right to refuse or admit any exhibit onto the ground where there is reason to suspect if either diseased or dangerous, or removing such exhibit from the ground.

All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor or their principle at the time of entry. All co-joint owners must be the property of a recognised firm or partnership (certificate of registration may be requested) and all exhibits when admitted to the showground will be under the control of the committee.

No exhibit will be removed from the ground before Saturday 7:20 pm without the permission of the stewards.

Parties in charge of exhibits must report their arrival on the ground immediately to the stewards. All names and other marks on exhibits indicating ownership must be removed to the satisfaction of the stewards but may be replaced after the judging. At the end of the show, pavilion exhibits will be delivered to the owners by the stewards.

Exhibitors will render themselves liable to a penalty of up to \$50 by removing any official placard, ticket or ribbon affixed or posted by the stewards, or affixing another ticket, placard or ribbon in lieu thereof, or by refusing in any way to carry out instructions of stewards, who shall incur no responsibility by putting these regulations into force.

The ages of exhibits of livestock, also breeders' name (where same are known) must be furnished by the exhibitor at time of entry. If desired by the committee, the exhibitor must make a statutory declaration that their exhibit conforms to the conditions under which the prizes they compete for are offered.

Exhibits which cannot be shown in any competing section may be offered as non-competitive exhibits.

The Association may withhold any prize when statements have erroneously and fraudulently been made regarding exhibits.

Should any exhibit have gained a prize be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The committee with or without the judge can decide the question.

Any protests must be lodged in writing with the Secretary (Secretary's Office - attached to Alan Elliott Pavilion) within half an hour of the event in question with a sum of \$20 attached. This sum may be forfeited if the protest is found to be frivolous or unproven.

Any infringement of these regulations will disqualify the exhibitor from taking a prize and when a fine is imposed and not paid within 14 days after receipt of notice being given, the exhibitor will be disqualified from taking part at any future show.

Public sales of such exhibits as owners may want to dispose of, shall be held on the showground. A commission or rebate of 1% on all sales effected shall be paid to the Secretary for the benefit of the Association. (continued on page 8)

## **Rules & Regulations** (continued from page 6)

Any stock or merchandise brought onto the ground for sale, not being an exhibit, the following fee will be charged : 3% of value.

The committee reserves the right to reduce the prize money or cancel any event of competition's not forthcoming in any of the classes in this schedule. Where trophies are listed, there must be two or more exhibitors before trophy is competitive.

The committee will not be held responsible for injuries, loss or damage to exhibits, exhibitors or personnel.

In case of dispute as to the construction of any of these regulations, the same shall be determined by the committee of the association.

Judges may award a second prize in lieu of first or may withhold altogether any prize money when there is only one exhibitor or when the exhibits are considered not worthy.

All persons who, after entering their exhibits (stock in particular) are unable to exhibit same should notify the Secretary at least three days before the Show to assist the stewards to make other arrangements.

Campers must apply for use of power upon arrival at ground.

Prize money must be collected on the day or at the latest within one month or it shall be forfeited.

Gate pass out must be obtained from the Secretary.

Parking fees \$1 per vehicle, except for vehicles carrying and/or towing livestock exhibits.

**Waiver forms must be signed (where required) before entries accepted.**

### **INFORMATION FOR STEWARDS AND JUDGES**

All stewards and judges are requested to note some duties as follows:

- Each steward must be in attendance at their respected pavilions at the appointed time to receive exhibits.
- Stewards are responsible for over-seeing all exhibits to ensure they are properly classed according to entry and all exhibits are placed together for judging.
- Stewards are responsible for the removal of exhibits and other persons from the area while judging is in progress.
- Stewards will deliver the entry book (and Steward/Judge Ribbons) to the Secretary after completion by the judge.
- Stewards will assist the judge and give any required information, but will not say or do anything to influence a judge's decision. Names of exhibits must not be revealed to the judge before judging and any other comments from the judge should not be revealed.
- After the show the stewards are requested to hand in their comments, adjustments, or ideas regarding their section to the Secretary so these can be noted for the next show. They should also indicate if they would be willing to be stewards for that section the following year.
- Chief stewards are expected to accompany the judge to lunch. A pass will be given for the judge, and the stewards may apply to the Secretary for his/her pass if needed.
- Special attention is drawn to the regulation that all stewards should withdraw whilst judging or exhibits in which they may have an interest, directly or indirectly, is taking place.

### **Rich Fruit Cake Competition**

Following are the rules and recipe for those wishing to enter the ASC Fruit Cake Competition (class 34). The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

#### **Rich Fruit Cake Competition Recipe**

250g (8oz) sultanas, 250g chopped raisins, 250g currants, 125g (4oz) chopped mixed peel, 90g (3oz) chopped red glace cherries, 90g chopped blanched almonds, 1/3 cup sherry or brandy, 250g plain flour, 60g self raising flour, ¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg, ½ teaspoon ground ginger, ½ teaspoon ground cloves, 250g butter, 250g soft brown sugar, ½ teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind, ½ teaspoon almond essence, ½ teaspoon vanilla essence and 4 large eggs.

### **Here's What You Do:**

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least one hour but preferably overnight.

- Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.
- Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be thick enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½ hours to 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

**Note:** to ensure uniformity and depending upon the size, it is suggested that the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Winners at Country Shows will each receive a cash prize of \$10 and will be required to bake a second "Rich Fruit Cake" in order to compete in the semi final to be conducted by each of the 14 Groups of the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW. ### **DEAD EASY CHOCOLATE CAKE** (Reference classes 25 and 43) (Peter Bennett)

#### **Ingredients**

1 1/3 cups (200 gr) S R Flour  
5 tablespoons (25 gr) sifted cocoa powder  
1 ¼ cups firmly packed (250 gr) brown sugar  
125 gr butter at room temperature  
2 eggs  
2 teaspoons vanilla  
2/3 cup (160 mls) water

#### **Method**

1. Pre-heat oven to 170C or 160 C for fan forced. Grease 20cm round cake pan, lining the base with non-stick baking paper.
2. Place all ingredients in a large bowl and beat on high for 2-4 minutes or until pale and silky smooth. Pour into pan and smooth the surface with the back of a spoon
3. Bake for 50-55 minutes until skewer comes out clean. Stand cake in pan for 5 minutes before turning out to cool.
4. Ice when cold with chocolate icing
