NLIS CHECKLIST PRIOR TO SHOW

Recording livestock movements at AgShows is good for everyone. Strong livestock traceability helps to protect our industry against disease, maintain exports, and improves our industry's international reputation. By working together, we can build a stronger and more productive industry. Do your part by following the steps below to send your animals safely to Agricultural Shows in New South Wales.

- 1 Obtain PIC & LPA accreditation
- 2 Vaccinate & test your animals
- 3 Apply approved NLIS device, ear tag, or swine brand to your livestock and record this on the NLIS database
- 4 Complete relevant show entry form (prior to the Show) and AgShows NSW Waiver (at the Show)
- 5 Before leaving your property, complete a National Vendor Declaration (NVD) or Transported Stock Statement (TSS) movement record for the forward and return journeys
- 6 Before leaving your property, ensure sheep, cattle, goats, and pigs are accompanied by an Animal Health Declaration relevant to the species
- 7 Before leaving your property, ensure sheep, cattle, goats, and pigs display an approved NLIS device, ear tag, or swine brand. Replace any damaged or lost devices.
- 8 Before leaving your property, ensure you and your livestock are covered by your own relevant insurances (e.g. Livestock in Transit).
- 9 Present all required paperwork to the responsible show society committee member prior to unloading animals
- 10 Comply with all timings and requirements for bump-in, unloading, and exhibiting

Steward Checklist

STEWARD CHECKLIST

Thank you for your commitment to our industry! Stewards like you play a crucial role in ensuring events like today run smoothly and protecting our production from disease. Agricultural Shows in NSW can be overwhelming, so we have put together this list to help you keep track of the most important tasks.

- I confirm we have obtained a showground PIC and a registered N LIS sporting account.
- I confirm our show society has completed the Emergency Animal Disease Action Plan (EADAP) from AgShows NSW.
- I confirm our show society has provided clear requirements for show entrants and timings for livestock bump-ins.
- I confirm that my allocation of livestock are fitted with an approved N LIS device, ear tag, or swine brand prior to unloading.
- I have reported cases of missing or damaged devices to the Chief Steward and responsible Show committee member.
- I confirm that exhibitors have provided a correctly completed National Vendor Declaration (NVD) or Transported Stock Statement (TSS), and Animal Health Declaration prior to unloading.
- I have confirmed with the Chief Steward that all exhibitors have a completed show entry form (if able) and AgShows NSW Waiver.
- I confirm that correct PIC codes are recorded for both the show and the property of origin.
- I have confirmed where animals are travelling after the show, and I have appropriately recorded all incoming livestock into the template provided.
- I have provided all incoming livestock data to the Chief Steward.
- I will report any ongoing biosecurity or traceability concerns to the responsible Show committee member and Chief Steward.
