# Recipe required to compete in Class H: Section 10

# **RICH FRUIT CAKE RECIPE**

# *Ingredients*

250g Sultanas

250g **Chopped Raisins** 

250g Currants

125g Chopped Mixed Peel

90g **Chopped Red Glaze Cherries** 

90g **Chopped Blanched Almonds** 

1/3 cup Sherry or Brandy

250g Plain Flour

60g Self – Raising Flour

**Grated Nutmeg** ¼ Teaspoon ½ Teaspoon **Ground Ginger** 

**Ground Cloves** ½ Teaspoon

> 250g Butter

Soft Brown Sugar 250g

Lemon Essence or Finely Grated Lemon Rind ½ Teaspoon

Almond Essence ½ Teaspoon Vanilla Essence ½ Teaspoon 4

Large Eggs

#### Method

- 1. Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.
- 2. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.
- 3. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after, each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
- 4. Place the mixture into a prepared tin square 20cm x 20cm (8' x 8') tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ to 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.
- 5. NOTE:- To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces

# Recipe required to compete in Class H: Section 14.

### **BOILED CARROT LOAF RECIPE**

# **Ingredients**

**Grated Carrot** 1 cup

¾ cup Chopped Raisins

34 cup Water

¾ cup Castor Sugar

**Butter** 30g

½ Teaspoon Ground Cinnamon

½ Teaspoon Ground Nutmeg

% cup Self – Raising Flour

34 cup Plain Flour

½ Teaspoon Bicarb Soda

½ cup Chopped Walnuts

#### Method

- 1. Combine carrot, raisins, water, sugar, butter, cinnamon and nutmeg in a saucepan. Stir over heat without boiling until sugar is dissolved.
- 2. Bring to the boil, reduce heat, cover and simmer for 10 minutes.
- 3. Cool to room temperature.
- 4. Stir in half the sifted flours and soda mixture, then remaining flour and walnuts. Spread into prepared loaf tin.
- 5. Bake in slow oven (150 160C) for about an hour, or until cooked.
- 6. Stand for 5 minutes before turning out.
