





Recipe for Class 23- Prune Muffins

INGREDIENTS

1 cup **VERITY** prunes chopped

1 cup Castor Sugar
2 eggs lightly beaten
1 cup Water
1 cup Plain flour
1 cup SR flour

1 teaspBicarb Soda

METHOD

- 1. Heat oven to 180C. Lightly grease a tray of 12 x ½ cup muffin cups
- 2. Place **VERITY** prunes, butter & sugar in a saucepan, bring to the boil & allow to simmer for 5 minutes. Cool slightly
- 3. Add eggs, bicarb soda, & both flours to prune mixture. Mix well. Spoon into Muffin Cups
- 4. Cook for 20-25 mins or until cooked through



RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION

State Wide Competition

- Winner at the Young Show will need to make a second Rich Fruit Cake to compete in the Regional Semi-Final in Dubbo on Feb 22nd 2020
- Regional winner will bake a third for the final judging at the Sydney Royal Easter Show
- Recipe to be followed exactly and Baked in a 20cm (8') tin

INGREDIENTS

250 gm Sultanas2 50gm Currants 250gm Plain Flour 250gm Butter 1/4 teasp Grated Nutmeg 4 large Eggs ½ teasp Vanilla Essence ½ teasp lemon essence 90gm chopped red glace cherries 250gm chopped raisins 90gm chopped blanched Almonds 125gm chopped peel 60gm SR Flour 250gm Brown Sugar ½ teasp Almond essence ½ teasp ground ginger 1/3 cup Sherry or Brandy ½ teasp ground cloves

METHOD

- 1. Mix together All fruit & nuts- sprinkle with the Sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hr (overnight is best)
- 2. Sift together flour & spices. Cream together butter & sugar with essences & add the eggs one at a time- beating well after each addition
- 3. Alternately add fruit & flour mixtures & mix thoroughly. Mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon
- 4. Place mixture in to prepared 20cm tin & bake in a slow oven for 3 ½- 4 hrs
- 5. Allow cake to cool in the tin

Section G- Jams & Preserves

Prize Money Donated by Mr & Mrs J & M Tout

- All exhibits to be cooked by exhibitor
- Each Container must be marked with the exhibitors label stating the nature of the contents
- Maximum size of Jars is to be 375 gm, any size Fowlers Jars for preserves
- Cellophane or unlabelled lids to be used on exhibits

Exhibitor Tips:

JAMS

- Good colour resembling fruit used- too dark may be result of caramelisation
- Aroma should have a slight sweetness- Overly sweet bouquet indicates too much sugar
- Consistency good set, syrup should bind the pieces- stiff consistency may be the result of overcooking
- Small, even pieces of fruit evenly distributed throughout the syrup. Clear Syrup, Jam should be free of froth or bubbles or evidence of crystallisation

CONSERVES

- Large or whole pieces of fruit evenly distributed in syrup. Fruit should retain its shape unlike Jam
- Ratio of fruit should be greater than syrup

MARMALADES

- Thin slices of fruit of julienne of citrus ring, evenly distributed throughout the syrup
- Syrup should be clear and firm set& fruit/rings should be consistent in size & shape
- Should be rich with well-developed colour not dark
- Visibility should be good even with darker fruit

JELLIES

- Rich well developed colour, not dark which could indicate overcooking
- Should be transparent, clear and not cloudy when held to light
- Must be extract products of fruit only- no colouring or glutinous material
- Should be firm and hold its shape for several minutes when cut with a spoon





RULES AND REGULATIONS

All competition at this show is governed by these regulations and by the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW Rules for Discipline in Horse Sections at Shows which can be viewed at www.agshowsnsw.org.au. Should it become necessary for the ASC Disciplinary Committee to open an inquiry into any aspect of competition in this Horse Section, this Society will support any penalty imposed by that Committee as a result of the inquiry and will support penalties resulting from enquiries arising from Horse Sections at other NSW Shows.

INDEMNITY AND WAIVER FORMS: Waiver form for Adult and Child competitors will be issued from the Horse Office

- 1 Refusal of Entry/Alteration of Schedule: The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry without assigning any reason for doing so and to alter the schedule to meet emerging circumstances.
- Judge's Decision/Discretion: The judge is empowered to withhold any or all prizes in any class where the exhibits are, in his/her opinion, unworthy of the prize, and at all times the judge's decision will be final. A judge has the discretion to ask that a led or performance exhibit and handler/rider/driver be ordered to leave the ring if he/she considers the animal is unruly and/or likely to cause an accident.
- 3 Stallions: must be wearing a bit at all times when being led and must be under the control of a person 17 years or age or older. They must be supervised at all times and securely fastened when tied to the outside of a truck or float. They are not eligible to compete in ridden classes unless their eligibility is specifically stated in the schedule.
- 4 Horse Measuring: No official measuring will take place at the show, but, if a question about height arises, proof of height may be required. In the absence of proof, a decision will be at the absolute discretion of the Ring Master or Chief Steward.





- 5 Lateness to the Ring: Competitors must be ready when called. Once judging has commenced, a competing horse shall not be led, ridden or driven into or out of the judging ring without the permission of the judge and/or the Ringmaster or Chief Steward.
- 6 Entries in Age, Breed Classes must be appropriately Registered for their Classes and MUST PRODUCE REGISTRATION PAPERS and current MEMBERSHIP CARDS on REQUEST.
- 7 Drugs: Drug testing may be carried out at this show.
- 8 Approaching Judges: No exhibitor or associate will initiate conversation with a judge on judging day, before, during or after judging except through the Ringmaster or Chief Steward.
- 9 Prohibited Relationship: No competitor will present for judging before a judge with whom he/she has a family relationship, has or has recently had a personal relationship or had horse related business dealings during the past twelve months.
- 10 Coaching: Any person detected coaching a competitor while that competitor is being judged may be removed from the Showground.
- 11 Proper Conduct: Any exhibitor or associate who behaves offensively on the Showground will expelled from the ground, may be banned from the show in future and may be banned by other Societies.
- 12 Cruelty: Persons who are considered by the Ringmaster or Chief Steward to be abusive or cruel to a horse will be expelled from the ground. No horse will be permitted to compete if, in the opinion of the Ring Master or Chief Steward, it is in poor health or condition.
- 13 Hendra Virus: It is not necessary to require all horses to be vaccinated in regard to this virus. However this is your choice. The only insurer requirement is for the entrant to declare on their entry form that the horse they are entering is healthy to the best of their knowledge and fit to compete.
- 14 **Protest:** Must be made in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$50.00 and lodged with the *Show Secretary* within ONE HALF HOUR (½) of the event. The fee of \$50.00 may be forfeited should the committee deem the protest frivolous.
- 15 Helmets: A safety helmet compliant with the current Australian Standard must be worn at all times when mounted
- Novice: The definition of a Novice is a Horse/Rider that has not won a 1st prize at any Agricultural Show.
- 17 ALL ELECTRICAL CORDS ARE TO BE RAISED AND NOT LAYING ON THE GROUND NO PIGGY BACKING.
- 18 THERE WILL BE NO CHANGES TO THE PROGRAM ON THE DAY Suggestions made in writing will be considered for next year's program.


