- Entries & Exhibits need to be in no later than 10 days prior to Show Day.
- Entries can be delivered to Nutrien Ag Solutions Bombala or Monaro Wool Services. Each fleece is to be delivered in a plastic bag, clearly labelled on the bag with the exhibitor's name.
- As per the regulations for pavilion exhibits, an entry fee (per fleece) will be payable upon entry. Please complete an entry form and pay entry fee/s at time of delivery of fleeces. Entry form in Show Schedule.

RULES

- A maximum of three fleeces per one micron class per exhibitor is allowed within
 each section. Where more than three fleeces are entered in one micron class, the
 wool steward will choose which fleeces to exhibit (depending on class size &
 available space the steward may choose to show all entries).
- 2. Unpaid entries will not be exhibited.
- 3. Fleeces must not have more than 12 month's growth.
- Fleeces must be skirted (insufficiently skirted fleeces will have the excess removed by the stewards before judging).

Note: Entries means you register your cake, slice, etc at the Show office on Wednesday or Thursday. You will be given a ticket for each entry called Exhibitors Ticket. On top of the ticket is the number you were given when you entered; Cooking is Section I; Class is the number in the Schedule before the cake, etc you have made. Underneath write the type you are entering. The ticket is to be attached to the **plate** (not bag).

RULES.

- All cooking to be displayed on suitable plates and in clear plastic bags, eg Oven Bags, (no cling wrap).
- 20cm (8") tins are to be used for Show cooking, and must not have a pattern on the bottom of the tin.
- · Only one entry per person per class.
- · No packet cakes to be used unless otherwise stated
- No cakes to be cooked in ring tins.

HINTS

Icing: Use only pure icing sugar with a little butter (not margarine - it doesn't set), and a little water or juice. Mix in a bowl over a saucepan of hot water. Mix to a slight pouring consistency, then ice.

Making Cakes for Showing: means they have to be evenly cooked; good texture with no holes in cake when cut. Not sunken on top or dented on sides from paper. If paper needed: cut to the size of the bottom of the tin. Only fruit cakes have paper sides. Let butter cakes, muffins or cup cakes stand a few minutes before tipping out. Tip them onto a cake cooler which has a towel or brown paper over it. Turn cake straight over so no marks appear on top or bottom of cake. DO NOT put hot cakes straight onto plate you are showing them on: they will sweat and become sticky.

Scones: do not use too much flour on board when making them. No flour is to be seen on the top or bottom of scones.

Lamingtons: are judged on texture and daintiness of cake and size. 5cm square.

Slices: to be cut in 5cm squares

Date Loaf: to be cooked in open loaf tin. Cut dates, place in bowl with sugar, butter, carb soda; pour boiling water over and stir until butter is dissolved. Let cool and add rest of ingredients.

Fruit Cakes can be made the weekend before the Show; they will keep leaving paper around them. **Date loaf, butter cakes, muffins, biscuits and slices** - make Wednesday or Thursday, also iced arrowroot. **Sponges**: make Thursday night. **Scones & pikelets**: Thursday night or Friday morning.


