

It should exhibit sound conformation and be free from hereditary defects and unsoundness and, like all good show horses, exhibit excellent quality and class.



# Ingredients:

125g butter, at room temperature, chopped 3/4 cup white sugar
2 eggs
1 1/2 cups self-raising flour
1/2 cup milk
Ripple Mixture
10g butter, chopped
1/4 cup white sugar
1/3 cup chopped walnuts 1 tbsp. cocoa powder

# Method:

1. Preheat the oven to moderate (180  $\,^\circ C$ ). Grease a 20cm (base measurement) spring form tin, and line the base with baking paper.

2. Use electric beaters to cream the butter and sugar until white and fluffy. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Fold in half the flour, then the milk, then remaining flour. Spoon half the mixture into the tin.

3. For the ripple mixture, combine the ingredients, rubbing with your fingertips until crumbly. Sprinkle half the mixture over the cake batter in the tin. Spread remaining batter into the tin, and sprinkle with remaining ripple mixture. Bake for 40minutes, or until cake is springy to a gentle touch.

4. Cool in the tin for 10 minutes, then release the sides and place onto a wire rack to cool.

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy.

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

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# **RULES OF CUDAL A & P SOCIETY**

All prizes awarded at the annual exhibition of the Society are subject to the following rules and regulations, any disregard of which will render the Exhibitor liable disqualification.

1.All entries to be made in writing and delivered by post or otherwise to the Secretary no later 8:00PM on THURSDAY 9TH SEPTEMBER 2017 (with the exception of Section J – Flowers). No entries accepted unless accompanied by appropriate entry fees.

2.All Exhibitors of horses and sheep must be the bonified owner of the same at the time of entry. In the event of there not being any competition the first prize will be awarded by the judges and the full amount of the prize money will be paid and if not deemed worthy the judge award a 2nd prize or if not of sufficient merit may decline to make an award.

Exhibitors of cereals, fruit and vegetables must be the growers and makers of the jams, jellies and preserved fruits only will be entitled to receive the prize.

Exhibitors of fat stock must be the breeder.

Stallions will not be allowed to compete in the hackney horse classes.

Local competitors MUST reside within 20km of Cudal Post Office or be active members of the Cudal Show Society.

3. Except in the Pavilion the same exhibit may compete for more than one Society's prize in two classes but after having won three society's first prizes will not then be eligible for another in the same exhibition but may compete for all special and HORSES prizes.

4. Exhibitors entered in the wrong class by Exhibitors will be excluded from the competition.

5.Exhibitors MUST have a person in attendance to parade livestock at the hour appointed.

6.Any exhibit appearing on the showground or in any enclosure set apart for judging the exhibits with any distinguishing mark or badge prior to the prize being awarded or during such time will be disqualified.

7.All exhibits must be delivered to the stewards for judging by the specified time and day of judging (as detailed in their appropriate sections of the Schedule).

8.NO EXHIBITS EXCEPT THOSE PERMITTED BY THE CHIEF PAVILLION STEWARD ARE TO BE REMOVED FROM THE GROUND BEFORE 3:30PM ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW.

Any person infringing this rule will become liable to disqualification from exhibiting in any further show and if the Exhibitor has been awarded prizes such prizes shall be liable to forfeiture.

9.Nominated entry fee as stated in each class is payable (including members).

10.Judges and Stewards will be admitted to the grounds free upon production of the card or pass issued by the Secretary. Passes are not transferable.

11.Once judging has commenced, Judges and Stewards ONLY shall be permitted to enter the pavilion until such time as the judging within has been completed.

12. Exhibitors MUST accept the decision of the Judges appointed by the Committee.

All protests MUST be made in writing and lodged with the Secretary before 5:00pm on the day of the Show, accompanied by a fee of \$1.00 and the sum may be forfeited if the protest is considered frivolous. The decision of the Committee shall be final and without appeal. When a first prize is divided the first and second prize money will be divided equally between the competitors and no second prize will be awarded.

13. The Society will take care of the exhibits sent to the Show, but will not accept responsibility whatsoever for damage that may occur to exhibits either by fire, theft or any other cause and will not accept entries from exhibitors subject to these rules being accepted by the exhibitor.
