RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Membership fee of \$20 entitles holder to admission for member and guest, members of family under 18 years, free parking, free entry for any section with prize money not exceeding \$5 (except Horse Events and Section G Dog Show). Single membership \$10.
2. Admission to Showground: Adults \$10; Children under 18 years \$2; under 5 years free.
3. The Committee will provide facilities to exhibitors and all care will be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be taken by the Committee.
4. Competitors taking part in any Show competition do so at their own risk.
5. To ensure there is no danger from overcrowding, non-official persons (including competitors and animals not immediately engaged) are required to vacate the Paddock area.
6. The Committee reserves the right of refusing or cancelling any entry without giving any reason therefore.
- 7. The Harold Howard Pavilion will be open to exhibitors at 7.30am and closes at 8.30am. It will close at 4.00pm for Stewards to dismantle exhibits and will re-open at 4.30pm for collection of exhibits.**
- 8. No exhibit may be removed from Showground before 4.30pm.**
9. In the event of only one entry in a class, the Judges may, if they consider it worthy, award a first and in the case of only two entries, the same may apply. On the other hand, they are empowered to withhold prizes.
10. The "Lockhart District" shall be interpreted to mean within a radius of 50km of Lockhart.
11. The Committee will not hold itself responsible for any errors or omissions in the Schedule. They are believed to be correct.
12. CAMPING FEES: \$5 per day plus \$10 per day for usage of power, minimum charge.
13. GROUND RENT: \$1 per foot or \$3.30 a metre. Minimum charge \$20 per day for usage of power.

It is my great pleasure to present to you the Lockhart Show of 2018.

I wish to introduce our new Secretary Ms Shirley Jobson. This position is probably the most important job within the Agricultural and Pastoral Society.

This year we have spent a considerable amount of money on entertainment for the patrons of the Show.

1. Mr Stewart Bryant, Whipcracking, from Mansfield. Stewart and his amazing stockhorse will entertain you with shows near the Grand Stand.
2. First Light Entertainment will amaze you with their talents on stilts and a circus workshop.
3. Justin McClelland, the chainsaw carving man from Tumberumba.
4. Old Kentucky Animal Nursery.

As well as these attractions, there will be the usual sideshow Dodgem Cars, Jumping Castle, etc to keep the children entertained. We would like to see more sideshows at Lockhart these days but the Showmen are business people and they need patronage in order to come to a Show and make a handsome return.

This year we welcome a new and generous co-sponsor for the Senior Showgirl Competition. Riverina Bluebell has kindly sponsored the Showgirl Competition with \$500. This is in addition to the major prize, which has been sponsored by Ian McLeod and Co for many years.

I encourage young ladies to enter this prestigious event in order to represent the Lockhart District at the various subsequent events after the Show. The idea is for these young women to bring awareness of Mental Health issues to young people at school and beyond, and to get the message across that "there is help available". More details of this event are listed elsewhere in the Schedule.

The Peter Schirmer Memorial Crop Competition is being staged again this year, with the Lockhart Ag Bureau as Stewards.

This is also run in conjunction with the other crop competitions, including the Field Wheat Competition of NSW, which is conducted in conjunction with Dept of Agriculture and ASC. Details of all these competitions are also within the 2018 Schedule.

For the past ten years, the Lockhart Agricultural and Pastoral Society has conducted the Lockhart Truck Show. Proceeds from this event go towards sending a young person to the Sydney Royal Easter Show for two days. Erica Alchin was chosen this year but was unable to attend due to University commitments. However, we have decided to send two people to the next Easter Show in 2019.

Last but not least, I wish to thank the Treasurer, Secretary, Vice Presidents, Stewards and the Show Committee for their good work and commitment in order to bring to you, the citizens of Lockhart and District, your Show.

This is the 'Shop Window of the District' and these people put on the Show for all to see what Lockhart is and what we can produce and attain.

- 2) The Lockhart Show Committee reserves the right to amend the program at any time
- 3) Lockhart Show has a strict policy in regard to inappropriate behaviour. Offenders WILL be advised to ASC/RAS Australia and banned from showing at Lockhart in the future.
- 4) All stallions must be bitted, double tied and handled/ridden by a person over the age of 18 years.
- 5) Horses must be registered with relevant society and the exhibitor a member of the society; papers must be available if requested. Electronic copies accepted.
- 6) Save time on the day and fill in the indemnity form attached to the schedule or see rule 17.
- 7) Rings will not be held for anybody
- 8) Lunch will be around 12pm – 12.30pm unless advised on the day

- 10) Supreme Rider- Ray Browne Memorial Cash Prize Donated by the Family of the Late Ray Browne eligible to all Champion Riders from Rings 1 & 2

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Recipe for STATE RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION

Sponsored by the Australian Dried Fruits Association. The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

Here's what you need.

250g (8oz) Sultanas, 250g (8oz) Chopped Raisins, 250g (8oz) Currants, 125g (4oz) Chopped Mixed Peel, 90g (3oz) Chopped Red Glaze Cherries, 90g (3oz) Chopped Blanched Almonds, 1/3 Cup Sherry or Brandy, 250g (8oz) Plain Flour, 60g (2oz) Self-Raising Flour, 1/4 Teaspoon Grated Nutmeg, 1/2 Teaspoon Ground Ginger, 1/2 Teaspoon Ground Cloves, 250g (8oz) Butter, 250g (8oz) Soft Brown Sugar, 1/2 teaspoon Lemon Essence OR finely Grated Lemon Rind, 1/2 Teaspoon Almond Essence, 1/2 Teaspoon Vanilla Essence, 4 Large Eggs.

Here's what you do:

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flour and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared tin, no larger than 20cm (8") and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 1/2 - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.
