


INSTRUCTIONS FOR STEWARDS

1. Stewards to be in place by 7.30am to get exhibits ready for judging. One steward from each section will collect folders, ribbons and prize cards from the chief steward.
2. Stewards must see that every exhibit carries an entry ticket, which corresponds with stewards book and must inform Judge if any exhibit is missing.
3. Judge will record result and inform Steward, who must record all prize winning entries.
4. Steward shall write owner's name in ink on prize card, corresponding to the winning ticket numbers indicated by the Judge.
5. Stewards are requested to wear their Steward's badge throughout the Show and be available as required for duty in their respective sections.
6. **After completion of judging, stewards shall check for mistakes and then deliver results sheets to Entries Stewards (located in Pavilion) to allow points and prize money calculations.** Points to be allocated as follows: First 5 points; and Second 3 points
7. Stewards are requested to provide hospitality to all Judges, and return all unused cards, ribbons, books immediately after judging.
8. All Stewards in the pavilion **MUST BE IN ATTENDANCE AT 4.15 PM ON SHOW DAY** to assist in return of exhibits.
9. It is the Society's policy that in the event of a tie for a trophy the eventual winner to be decided by draw from a hat.
10. If an equal first is awarded in any section, no second place will be awarded.
11. Prize money not collected on show day will be forfeited to Walbundrie Show Society.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. All young horses must be led on the Showground
2. All exhibits must be bona-fide property of Exhibitor one month prior to Show.
3. ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE EITHER ONLINE or in writing with the Secretary
4. **All exhibits must be on the ground by 8.30 am sharp. No exhibits will be accepted at the pavilion after this time. JUDGING TO COMMENCE AT 8.45 AM**
5. All exhibitors must place their exhibits in the space allotted for them by the Stewards.
6. Judges are empowered to withhold prizes in sections where exhibits are considered unworthy.
7. **THE COMMITTEE WILL GIVE EVERY POSSIBLE FACILITY TO EXHIBITORS & EVERY CARE WILL BE TAKEN OF EXHIBITS, BUT NO RESPONSIBILITY WILL BE INCURRED BY THE SOCIETY.**
8. **Pavilions to close at 4.15pm so exhibits can be picked up at 4.30 p.m.**
9. Protests, with \$50 deposit, which shall be forfeited if the protest be deemed frivolous, must be lodged with the Secretary within ½ hour of event and will be dealt with by the Executive

Rules & Regulations for Dog Jump Competition

The competition is a test of the dog's jumping ability.

The competition is open to all dogs and bitches.

The dog is to jump over the log wall; however the dog can touch any part of the jump to get over the wall.

It is suggested that two handlers are required, with one handler releasing the dog at the jump run up and the other handler to catch the dog on the other side of the jump.

The dogs can be encouraged over the jump by a handler, vocally or visually.

The dogs can remain on the lead during the run up and jumping, however the dogs cannot be assisted by either handler by pushing or pulling the lead or the dog.

All dogs not jumping must be on a lead, with a handler in the marshalling area away from the jump run area.

Only one dog may be loose in the competition area at any one time.

The owner has the right to select the height, above the minimum height, at which the dog will commence competition. Once in the competition, dogs must jump all following jumps.

Each dog is allowed three jump attempts at each height if necessary until only one dog remains to provide a winner. If more than one dog has jumped the final height, a count back on refusals is to be done and the dog with the least refusals will be the winner. If all are equal the prize is shared, with each dog declared joint winners.

Dogs shall be disqualified if unsuccessful on the 3rd attempt.

Any mishandling or misuse of any dog will incur immediate disqualification.

Bitches in season are not permitted on the ground.

Each entrant must have completed and signed the Entry Form, and agree and understand that their dog/dogs and they have entered the competition/s at their own risk and that the conveners and/or their representatives accept no responsibility for any risk or injury, however caused.

The President's Medal.

This award celebrates excellent agricultural achievers, who innovate modern ideas to sustain the key industry in our local area, and have a willingness to share their knowledge. The recipient shows a readiness to utilise proactive means of thinking to provide a new technology, or utilise the produce surrounding, them to create a quality product. They showcase the purpose and longevity of agricultural show through their unique design.

Examples of agricultural achievers include machinery design, diverse vegetable propagation, garments made from local fibres, or even local bee production. It can involve entries in the show, but is not exclusive to entries. The only limits involve the broad aspect of agriculture.

The President's Medal will be presented to a member of the community during the opening of the show.

INGREDIENTS:

250g sultanas 250 g chopped raisins

250 g currants

125 g chopped mixed peel

90 g chopped red glace cherries

90 g chopped blanched almonds

1/3 cup sherry or brandy

250 g plain flour

60 g self-raising flour

1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

1/2 teaspoon ground cloves

250g butter

250g soft brown sugar

½ teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind

½ teaspoon almond essence

½ teaspoon vanilla essence

4 large eggs.

RECOMMENDED METHOD: Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after, each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Note: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Judge Note: The height of the cake should not exceed 5.7cm (57mm)

Three Different Types: the 3 items in an entry must differ from each other in terms of their construction technique and/or their purpose eg.1 a knitted jumper, blanket and tea cosy OR eg.2 a knitted tea cosy, a crocheted tea cosy or a felted tea cosy OR eg.3 a knitted jumper, a knitted blanket and a crocheted blanket. 2. The whole article and/or garment must be constructed of, and contain a minimum of, 80% SHEEP wool. 3. Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc and must be hand crafted (use of machine is permitted). 4. A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit. If a label is not available such as in the case of a hand spun or felted item, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice." 5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organization. 6. All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s. 7. An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final. 8. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level. 9. An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again. 10. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select three suitable individual exhibits and, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned. 11. It is the responsibility of the Group Secretary and winner to co-ordinate the transfer of the winning entry to the ASC Office in Sydney for the State Judging. 12.
